DESIGN FOR A FONT OF PRINTING-TYPE.

SPECIFICATION forming part of Design No. 20,192, dated October 7, 1890.

Application filed September 10, 1890. Serial No. 364,589. Term of patent 7 years.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, HENRY BREHMER, a citizen of the United States, residing at New York city, in the county and State of New York, have invented and produced a new and original Design for Type-Fonts, of which the following is a specification, reference being had to the accompanying drawing, forming part thereof, which illustrates the upper and lower cases of the type-letters and the numbers accompanying such forts.

bers accompanying such fonts.

The design of the type shows the general characteristics of script, and the peculiar characteristics of the type of the upper case consist in the decidedly heavy solid curved shading of the letters at the top and at the bottom, the inner ends of the heavy curved lines vanishing in intermediate narrow lines.

In the letters A and H the cross-line is of scroll pattern. The letters P and L terminate 20 in scroll lines, and the stems of the letters T and Y are decorated with a scroll figure. The letters of the lower case have the same peculiar characteristics as those of the upper case, and in the letters commencing with an approximately straight line the upper shading is given the shape of an essentially crescent scroll. The shading of the figures belonging to the font corresponds to that of the letters.

I claim—

The design for type, substantially as herein shown and described.
